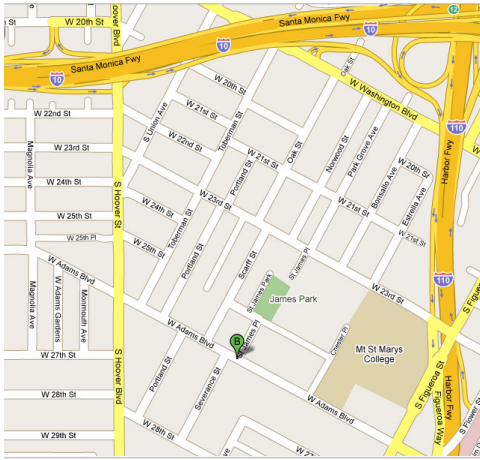
**Maximizing Auditory Performance:  
Selecting and Monitoring Technology**

Technology is the most important habilitative tool available for children with hearing loss. We hear what we say. There are important decisions that are involved in knowing what types of technology are needed and when. Decisions about technology should not be left to audiologists. Parents, children (yes, children); auditory verbal therapists and teachers have significant information to contribute to the discussion about how a child is performing with technology and contributing to the decision about when technology needs to be changed (changing from one hearing aid to another, from HA to CI, when FM is needed). This presentation discusses the different technologies, evaluation protocols, factors to be considered in when to change technology and contributions of each member of the team.

**Speech Perception: Evaluation &  
Using the Information to  
Improve Performance**

Speech perception testing can provide important information that can be used to select technology, modify technology settings for hearing aids, cochlear implants and FM systems; plan remediation; and select and improve educational management. This workshop will describe the different tests available, discuss how to select the appropriate test and how to interpret the test results for planning technology, rehabilitation and for making educational management decisions. Case presentations will be used.
